

Herb Rosemary

Latin Name Pack Size

Rosmarinus officinalis Approx. 180 Seeds

Fragrant and fabulous, this evergreen shrub is a herb garden essential. Their aromatic leaves are perfect for meaty dishes and will attract pollinators in abundance! It has even won the RHS Plants for Pollinators award. Appears in grey-green shades and can produce small, pale pink and blue flowers.



Sowing Instructions



Sow indoors from March to May or September to October. Press seeds into well-drained, moist compost, making sure not to cover them as they need light to germinate.



Over sow as under 50% of seeds germinate. If they're failing to germinate, move them somewhere that's 4°C for 4 weeks and then return them somewhere warm.



Transplant seedlings when they're big enough into larger pots before planting them outdoors once the danger of frost has passed. Avoid cutting them back too harshly as they will fail to grow back.

Days to harvest to maturity

14 - 21 days.

Tips

Can grow to an impressive height of 6ft if left to its own devices, so trim it often to keep it in check.
